



The spirit of 1971 : Dr. Mohammed Fazle Rabbee

Dr. Mohammed Fazle Rabbee was a renowned cardiologist, medical researcher and the joint professor of Cardiology and Internal Medicine at Dhaka Medical College and Hospital.

Born :

21 September 1932, in Pabna.

Graduation:

Dhaka Medical College in 1955.

Post-graduation:

In March 1960, he earned an MRCP in both cardiology and internal medicine..

Biography

After Dr. Rabbee finished his studies, he returned to East Pakistan on 1 January 1963, where he became an associate professor of medicine at Dhaka Medical College.

Sooner promoted to Professor of cardiology, DMCH & was the youngest MRCP staff member to achieve this promotion in Dhaka Medical College at the age of 36.

Dr. Rabbee was an exceptional clinician, as well as a medical researcher. He had his research-based articles published in the British Medical Journal and The Lancet.

1970: When the repression of East Pakistanis reached a peak, Rabbee received the Pakistan best professor award which he refused to accept

1971: Both he and his wife became completely engaged in the liberation war. They helped and protected countless freedom fighters and their families from death and disaster.

Death

On 15 December 1971, a group of Pak army with the help of the al-badr abducted him from his residence at Siddheswari and was brutally killed when the Bangladesh Liberation War was ending.
